SCHOOL LEADERSHIP TEAM CONFERENCE

I will be out of the school Wednesday, Thursday and Friday this week attending the SLT meeting in Broome. All Kimberley Government Schools have Principals and some Associate Principals and Deputy Principals attending. The Regional Executive Director, Mr Greg Robson and other presenters will be providing information and Professional Development across the 3 days.

KSOTA SERVICE

The 5 SOTAs across WA have been in a cycle of reduced funding over the past 4 -5 years.

There has been some debate in the media over the past few days about this issue.

Our school has been utterly proactive in confronting the new reality.

The facts are that the staff and the families of KSOTA have worked to confront the issues that a reduction in funding has brought to the table. We have been

meeting the challenge head-on since 2012. Indeed our school is well placed to meet the challenges. Our service today has not suffered any major impact by the reduction in funding.

THE FACTS

If your Year I-6 child is enrolled for the full school year (Terms I-4) you can expect these services from KSOTA.

- We aim to make 2-3 home visits to each family across a 4 term school year.
- Home Tutors Seminar (5 days Broome Camp School) Term 2. No cost to families.
- Term 3 Camp. (Different site each year). No Cost to families.
- ECE Camp end of year. (Broome Camp School). Term 4. No cost to families.
- SOTA Muster Years 5-7. Perth. Term 4. Currently \$500 per child.

If you child is only enrolled terms 2 and 3, students and their Home Tutors and family are welcome to attend any events that take place in those terms. However, the number of home visits is reduced.

HOW KSOTA IS FUNDED

Every WA Government Primary school is funded by the number of enrolments that they have.

This is referred to as the student centred funding model. It was introduced 2012/2013.

The numbers of enrolments are taken on census day. Census day usually falls in the middle of February. This year census day was the 17th February. Every student in a Government school In WA is funded as to where they are enrolled on census day. This funding stays with the school attended on census day even if the student moves to a new school after census day. If a student is out of the state or enrolled in another school on census day they take no funding with them to their new school.

CANBERRA CAMP

This camp has traditionally been held every two years and middle and upper primary students have attended. Currently our school is committed to attending the Canberra camp next year. The camp used to be generously subsidised by the school and most years the cost to families was only \$200. No school can afford to extend this to families these days. The camp has had to become cost neutral to the school. The P&C has committed to supporting the camp that is due to go ahead in 2018. Moving forward it may prove untenable for this camp to continue.

The teachers and other staff of this school have all worked very hard over the past 4 years to meet the challenges brought about by the new fiscal reality. We are doing the job and meeting the challenges. I believe that the school today is in a better place than it has been previously. Individual lessons and more time on air for students I-7 currently reflect the commitment shown by staff.

In my opinion the school needs to be commended. The P&C have been fantastic in their efforts to ensure funds are available for Canberra 2018 and in displaying their understanding of the changes that have come about.
